### Step by Step Guide to Woodblock Printing and Supplies

Make an even line of ink with the putty knife and use your rubber brayer to roll out an even surface of ink. If you have the right amount of ink, you will hear a quiet hissing sound while rolling the brayer. If you have too much ink, the hissing will be louder and sound more like Velcro.

### Making Woodblock Prints - Merlyn Chesterman and Rod Nelson ...

When printing the woodblock, carefully build up the underlay until the block prints evenly and densely. Heavy impression will crush most woods except for the toughest hardwood (and difficult to

carve) species. Start with a light impression and add underlay slowly and carefully.

The production of classic Japanese woodblock prints is a fairly complex process, involving a number of steps, each usually performed by a different person, one skilled in that particular step. I say "classic" because in the modern Japanese print movement, often the artist performs all the steps themselves.

### **Production of Japanese Woodblock Prints**

To create a woodblock print in the traditional Japanese style, an artist would first draw an image onto washi, a thin yet durable type of paper. The washi would then be glued to a block of wood, and—using the drawing's outlines as a guide—the artist would carve the image into its surface. The artist would then apply ink to the relief.

Oil could be used to make the lines of the image more visible. An incision was made along both sides of each line or area. Wood was then chiseled away, based on the drawing outlines. The block was inked using a brush or brushes. A flat hand-held tool called a baren was used to press the paper against the inked woodblock to apply the ink to the paper. The traditional baren is made in three parts, it consists of an inner core made from bamboo leaves twisted into a rope of varying thicknesses ...
