Pablo Picasso (1881-1973) is regarded as the most influential artist of the 20th century. One key feature of his oeuvre is that he effortlessly crossed techniques, styles, and disciplines of art (1, 2). Another is that he appropriated styles and templates of both past and contemporary artists, creating works that "conversed" with them .

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
